The supermarket scrip program has been, and continues to be, a resounding success. Cards are available for both Bashas' (may be used at AJ's and Food City) and Sprouts.

These cards are \$25 each. Bashas' cards may be reloaded - and we receive credit for these reloads. Fry's Loyalty card needs to be registered and Temple Beth Emeth has to be chosen in the Community Rewards section. It is easy to tell - at the very bottom of each Fry's receipt you will see "At your request, Fry's will donate to Temple Beth Emeth".

In addition to the above mentioned cards, an order is placed each month for cards from MANY restaurants, retail stores, etc. The completed order form is to be turned in by the last Saturday of each month - accompanied by your check for the total amount.

These cards are available the following Saturday. The synagogue receives an amount which varies from 2% all the way to 12% of the face value of the card. Please think about the regular purchases you make. Cards are available for many types of businesses - department stores, restaurants, gasoline stations, discount stores, etc.

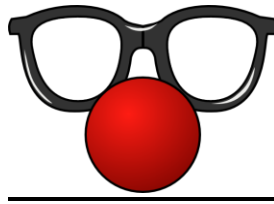
